An Invitation to Service

October 6 is World Communion Sunday, a day when Christians of every denomination celebrate unity in and as the Body of Christ. Dr. Lisa Hancock of <u>Discipleship Ministries</u> reminds us that "For all that makes us different from one another, we share in this sacrament that Christ gave us as a means of grace that helps us remember ... that we are connected to one another in the family of God through Jesus Christ." Precursors to acknowledging that sacred connection are planning, preparation, and prayer.

On the first Sunday of every month, our pastors are joined by Communion Stewards, familiar faces with a sacred charge, "to [prepare] the bread, wine and the communion ware for use in the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper" (*Glossary*, umc.org). They move quietly through the chancel and sanctuary, making sure that each congregant has access to the elements of communion, bread and "wine" that symbolize the body and blood of Jesus Christ. The first Sunday of October, their work and the work of our Communion Visitation ministry resonate worldwide.

What does it take to become a Communion Steward? Election at Charge Conference is one step in entering the ministry. A spirit of hospitality is key. Willingness to serve God is most important. Michael Peters, Chair of the Holman Communion Stewards, embraces the power of "the work that God has called us to do. At the same time, it is an open invitation for any members of the church that may want to consider giving back from their God-given talents." Consider the invitation. Breast Cancer Awareness

The Dharma of Mastectomies

On the fourth day of the Meditation Challenge, mother tells me that she has breast cancer. It is just after the New Year, and I am trying to become a new me. I don't expect to be tested so soon. We are lucky: they've caught it early. Apparently, there is such a thing as "stage- zero". The diagnosis was made two months ago, and she has opted for a mastectomy. The surgery is in four days. Four days? How had we not known?

My mother kept her mouth clamped through Thanksgiving even Christmas. wanting to further mar what the pandemic had already ruined. This is the reason she asked for soft button up pajamas, saying the ones she owned chafed. Pouring over material descriptions, and reviews. I searched for the best and settled on a satin cheetah print described as "lustrous and silkv."

All along, there has been a hidden truth - she will need them during recovery. "That," she tells us proudly "was part of my trick." Through the screen. my mother's face is measured, deliberately serene as if she were the doctor relaying news about the gauzy cluster in my mammogram. She is trying to control our reaction with her own, holding back tears to

make sure ours never fall. My sisters and I oblige, more obedient than we've ever been.

On the eighth day of the Meditation Challenge, I visualize a mountain, K2 to be specific. My mother is not a quarry to be excavated. She is solid granite - sturdy and unyielding, a taut peak rising into the sky. Still, equanimity remains elusive. I am scared. My coworker's father went in for an operation and did not come out. What if this is how I lose her?

The day of the surgery, I do what I can to move normally, as though my mother's life isn't hanging precariously from a ledge on the other side of the country. I teach breathlessly, air catching in my chest, yearning to heave under the weight of tears I cannot release in front of my students and colleagues. minutes and painfully plod until my sister calls to say that our mom is out and resting, that the surgeon says it went well, that the part of my mother's body trying to kill her has been removed and will not succeed in stealing her from us after all. That the crumblina temple mν mother still stands.


